## Healthy Kids Leadership Training

is coming to Westchester in the Fall of 2006 for FREE!

The New York State Recreation & Park Society (NYSRPS), in collaboration with the New York State Office of Children and Family Services (NYSOCFS) is privileged to provide the 2006 Healthy Kids Training Institute Program. As the demand grows for structured, supervised care of our youth during parents' work hours, the demands on the skills of New York's Recreation and Park Program Leaders also grow tremendously. Recognizing the need to provide more tools and skills to the employees of recreation centers across the state, NYSRPS has prioritized the implementation of a LEADERSHIP Training, which would provide such skills to their Program Leaders.

Healthy Kids Training is a 3-hour training session delivered to Recreation and Park Program Leaders to provide the skills they need in both Leadership and Health and Fitness. This seminar will be utilized as a Train the Trainer Model (TOT) in which NYSRPS professionals will be trained to deliver the final training to recreation and park Program Leaders. Once NYSRPS professionals have been through the training, these personnel are now ready to go out and deliver the training to all their agency staff. The training covers 3 essential areas of expertise for Program Leaders:

- The 4 Tools System: Creating a Brain-Friendly Environment
  This section encompasses both EMOTIONAL HEALTH and PHYSICAL HEALTH. An additional benefit is lowered incidences of discipline problems
- 2) LeaderSHAPE
  This section gives Program Leaders the essential leadership, communication, and conflict resolution skills needed when working with children.
- 3) Health & Fitness

  This section gives Program Leaders an understanding of basic physical fitness for young children and pre-teens. It also teaches them how to focus on different aspects of fitness in an inclusive way that allows heavier children to feel comfortable and capable when participating in "fitness" activities.

Did I mention this is FREE and will only take 3 hours out of your work day? Plus, you will receive a manual and a CD-ROM to print additional training materials.

The session will be held on Tuesday, September 12, 9 AM to 12 Noon at the New Castle Recreation Community Center, 10 Senter Street in Chappaqua. Reserve your spot early, since space is limited!
