

Community Spotlight - Sleepy Hollow

There's no better season to showcase the Village of Sleepy Hollow, NY than the fall. The small little village of 11,000 people becomes a tourist destination each September and October. It is estimated that over 100,000 people visit during Halloween season. There's also not a better year to showcase Sleepy Hollow, as 2024 is the 150th Anniversary of the village's incorporation. But before we talk about what has been going on recently, we need a brief history lesson.

The village is known internationally through "The Legend of Sleepy Hollow", an 1820 short story about the local area and its infamous specter, the Headless Horseman, written by Washington Irving, who lived in Tarrytown and is buried in Sleepy Hollow Cemetery. Currently, the village is home to the Philipsburg Manor House, The Hudson Valley Writers Center and the Old Dutch Church of Sleepy Hollow, as well as the afore mentioned Sleepy Hollow Cemetery.



Before known as Sleepy Hollow, the village was referred to as North Tarrytown. North Tarrytown's claim to fame was the General Motors Corporation plant down by the river. GM eventually became the biggest car manufacturer in the world. From 1915 to 1996, the plant



was the region's largest employer, running three shifts at its peak and fueling the local economy. The plant ultimately churned out more than 11 million cars and trucks. When General Motors closed the plant in New York in 1996 for cheaper property elsewhere, the Village of North Tarrytown lost more than 4,000 jobs and its main source of tax revenue.

To avoid letting their hometown fall into destitution, locals decided to think like marketers and voted to rebrand North

Tarrytown as Sleepy Hollow in honor of Washington Irving's short story. This wasn't unanimous as some old-timers still hold on to the North Tarrytown name in protest, but the change successfully transformed the industrial town into a spooky destination and a beautiful fall attraction for people from all over the globe.

Due to the large number of tourists in September and October, the village hosts special events every weekend. It kicks off with an all-day block party on Beekman Ave. in September and continues with an Oktoberfest, a Pop-Up Shop, a Glass Pumpkin Festival, a Street Fair, the Make-A-Wish "Walk For Wishes", an international film festival, a stand-up paddleboard festival on the Hudson River where the participants dress up in costume, a 10K Halloween themed road race and finally a two-day haunted hayride which is featured on the New York State's Tourism TV commercials. All these events co-inside with the programs geared for the local families such as pumpkin decorating, "Truck or Treat" and kid's costume parades.

As previously mentioned, 2024 is the 150th anniversary of the village's incorporation. To celebrate this milestone, a year-long slate of events was planned. It all started with a giant illuminated "Pumpkin Drop" (in lieu of the Times Square ball drop) on New Year's and continued with a showcase event each month. Some of those days to remember included an outdoor ice-skating party, a car show, a mermaid festival, a carnival and a music festival. The village also held a tree planting initiative challenging resident to combine efforts to plant 150 trees over the year.

Sleepy Hollow has six parks now and that number is going up. The former General Motors site is being redeveloped into a mixed-use community called Edge-on-Hudson. This joint venture was announced in 2014 and construction began in 2016. The development includes 1,177 housing units, a 140-room hotel, retail space (DeCicco's being built as we speak) and over 16 acres of parkland. The village dedicated a new waterfront park to the community in October 2022. The development also includes a project called Sleepy Hollow Common on the East Parcel of the site. This project will include a baseball/lacrosse/soccer field, tennis/pickleball courts, a skatepark, a performance amphitheater and more.

So, with all those events and all that development, it doesn't appear Sleepy Hollow is sleepy after all!

Tarrytown Recreation Happenings

Tarrytown Halloween Parade October 26th

Winner of the "Best of Westchester: Best Parade" award by Westchester Magazine for the 8th consecutive year, The Tarrytown Halloween Parade, a beloved annual tradition, returned in 2024 for its 22nd year under the guidance of the Tarrytown Recreation Department. An estimated 15,000 Tarrytown residents and visitors alike converged on Broadway and Main Street on Saturday, October 26th for an evening of spooky costumes, creative floats, live music, and Halloween fun. The parade began at 5:00 PM at Patriots Park and proceeded along Broadway and down Main Street.







The event has grown significantly over time, with safety remaining the top priority. Preparations for the parade each year begin as early as February, involving collaborative meetings between the Recreation Department, Police Department, Department of Public Works, Village Administrator's office, and Halloween Parade Committee. This year, in an effort to enhance spectator safety, the Village of Tarrytown acquired 400 new interlocking barricades to line the parade route. Immediately following the parade each year, a block party takes place on Main Street featuring outdoor dining, music, a beer truck, food trucks, and vendors.

- If you are registering for the first time, select new registration and enter "Westchester Recreation and Parks Society" as the company name, use the same member ID# as above.
- Make sure to double-check your personal information, the system might default to the Town of Cortlandt's info. Adjust these details to your own.
- On the next page you will find the section that has certifications/classes with fees associated with them. Skip past these registration options.

When you reach the section labeled "Registration Categories," choose the "4-day Technical Pass" this will give you access to the free educational sessions and show floor pass. You will have to choose which classes you want to attend each day or you can indicate that you will not be attending sessions.
